



Federal Funding FY2024 & FY2025



Key Terms

youth **endow**

Budget = Your credit card limit.

Appropriations = The act of using your credit card for an expense.

The "President's Budget" is a request to Congress.





Overview

FY2024 began on **October 1, 2023**.

However, funding for FY2024 is still **not** finalized.

The federal government is operating under temporary funding until **March 1** & **March 8**.

Congress must finalize FY24 funding by early March, or the government will **shutdown**.





Overview



Simultaneously, Congress is beginning to work on funding for **FY2025**.

FY25 starts on October 1, 2024.

Congress (and advocates) are working on two fiscal years concurrently:

- Finalizing FY2024 appropriations
- Starting FY2025 appropriations



Youth Collab's FY24 Appropriations Priorities

Runaway and Homeless Youth (RHY)

\$146.3 million (level funding)

Youth Homelessness Demonstration Program (YHDP)

- \$107 million (level funding)
 - Of which, \$25 million shall be for Youth Homelessness System Improvement (YHSI) grants

Youth Mentoring Grants (YMG)

• \$110 million (+\$3 million)



Possible FY2024 Funding Outcomes





Options for FY2024

- 1. Funding is finalized by early March.
 - Merge House and Senate funding bills.
- 2. Funding is *not* finalized by early March, and:
 - "Non-essential" government functions close;

or

Congress passes another short-term funding solution;
 or

Congress passes a year-long "continuing resolution."





Top 3 Keys for Success





#3: Get Ahead of it

What often happens:

- Start planning grant development tasks <u>after</u> funding announcement is released
- Grant writing amongst a thousand other deadlines and busy schedules

How to avoid this:

- Start planning early
 - Identify the grant development roles and timeline
 - Review prior funding announcements for consistencies in criteria
 - Update material from 3 years ago (or more)

#2: Use Criteria to Your Advantage

What often happens:

- Application doesn't follow the criteria
- Repeat criteria
- Omit a direct response to criteria



How to avoid this:

- Follow the criteria EXACTLY
- Don't just name it, explain it
- Ensure every paragraph relates to the criteria and shows reviewers HOW it is relevant





#1: Objective Review PRIOR to Submission

What often happens:

- Rely on previous performance
- Rely on previous success
- Assume reviewer knowledge and responsibilities

How to avoid this:

- Complete an objective review
- Use more than one person
- Engage a qualified reviewer for that specific federal department








Proposal Review Service

- Objective review of full proposal by experienced federal reviewers
- Criteria by criteria feedback
- Single & double review options

What to Expect: FY2025



"Silly season" (a.k.a. an election year)

Republicans control the House by a **two-seat** margin, creating challenges to governing.

The Senate remains in Democratic control but most legislation –including funding bills– will require at least 9 Republican votes to pass.




What to Expect: FY2025 Federal Funding

President Biden's FY2025 budget request to be released soon.

Congress is already working on FY2025 **appropriations** (including earmarks!).

Quick, **early progress**, then stalled through the summer until the elections.


"Lame duck" session to finalize FY25 after November 5.

What to Expect: FY2025

March, April, and May will be the best times to engage in appropriations advocacy.

Advocate **early** and **often!**

All advocacy is local!





F-150 XLT weighs ~4,700 lbs.



Avg. Annual Federal Spending = 4,700 billion



Mandatory spending ~ 3,300 lbs.





Discretionary spending ~1,400 lbs.





Defense spending ~649 lbs. Non-defense spending ~698 lbs.

RHY funding = \$146 million


YHDP funding = \$107 million

The Federal Budget FY'21 (in billions)




Appropriations: Putting it in Perspective

What to Expect: FY2025


Most legislation will not pass Congress – too much division between Senate Democrats and House Republicans.

FY25 appropriations will likely be finalized, but only <u>after</u> the November elections.


